Dear film fans

It's the nearly the end of July which can mean only one thing, we're back.

After a brief holiday (well not quite) we are back after this year's wonderful Buxton Fringe and Festival with more films to quench your cinematic thirsts. British film *The Guernsey Literary and Potato Peel Pie Society* is a stunning tale of love and friendship that follows writer Juliet Ashton (Lily James) who forms an unexpected bond with the residents of Guernsey in the aftermath of World War II. The initially hesitant residents begin to share their experiences of the Nazi occupation, and an idea for a book starts to form. **If you liked Ladies in Lavender you'll love a slice of Potato Peel Pie.**

Oscar Wilde in the late 1800s was the toast of London. His celebrity status soared after the success of his novel The Picture of Dorian Gray and his play The Importance of Being Earnest. However, it was his fall from grace which made him notorious, including his imprisonment and sadly early death. Rupert Everett is magnificent as Wilde in *The Happy Prince*, who in his tragic last days reminisces over his life with a curious detachment and humour. **If you like Wilde then The Happy Prince is for you.**

Ocean's 8 is the all-women addition to the extending Ocean's franchise. Picking up the threads of the previous films, Danny Ocean's estranged sister attempts to pull off the ultimate heist at the New York City's Met Gala. This film is packed to the rafters with talented ladies including Sandra Bullock, Cate Blanchett, Anne Hathaway, Sarah Paulson and Helena Bonham-Carter. **If you liked any (or all) of the previous Ocean's films these ladies are waiting to steal you onto their side.**

The ultimate film of the summer is bound to be the all singing all dancing *Mamma Mia! Here We Go Again.* Our favourite ABBA aficionados are back as history repeats itself when Sophie (Amanda Seyfried) faces the prospect of being a young mum. Discovering mum Donna's past brings the party back to the screen once more. This film promises to be as popular as the first, with catchy songs, comedy and some star performances. **If you were thinking 'Gimme, Gimme, Gimme' another Mamma Mia, then here it is with a side serving of Cher.**

'It's Alive!' is the famous line everyone remembers from Frankenstein, but what about the lady behind the words? *Mary Shelley* was an English novelist and writer who scandalously eloped with Romantic poet, Percy Shelley. Raised by her father to have her own mind, *Mary Shelley* the film is not a standard period drama. Full of feminist fire and tragedy this film charts how this gothic masterpiece was formed into the most enduring monster story of all time. **If you're a fan of Dracula, then Mary Shelley is right down your dark alley.**

It may seem improbable that Ethan Hunt is still dashing about getting into bother while completing jaw-dropping stunts; however, it is not impossible. The Mission Impossible franchise returns once more for *Mission: Impossible – Fallout*. Tom Cruise and his usual band of IMF cronies (Simon Pegg, Ving Rhames, and Rebecca Ferguson) are joined this time by Henry Cavill and Angela Bassett. When an IMF mission ends badly, Ethan takes it upon himself to fulfil his original briefing. Questions are raised about his loyalty and motives as his races against time to try and prevent a global catastrophe. **If you loved the action-packed adrenalin rush from the all the other Mission Impossible films, there's no need to leap out of an aeroplane, you'll love this at Buxton Cinema.**

The final years of Oscar Wilde, and the ghosts that haunted him, are vividly evoked in Rupert Everett's directorial debut. The film opens in Paris, where Wilde, by now in his forties, penniless and in poor health, is still reeling after being imprisoned in England for his love affair with Lord Alfred 'Bosie' Douglas. Out of prison but a pariah, Wilde swings between grief and a determination to enjoy whatever pleasure and beauty he can from the time he has left.

The drug war on the US/Mexico border has escalated as the cartels have begun trafficking terrorists across the US border. To fight the everescalating war, federal agent Matt Grave (Josh Brolin) reteams with the mercurial Alejandro (Benicio del Toro) to eliminate the problem.
