Michael Haneke puts his masterful directorial skills to a satirical look at the troubled high-bourgeoisie Laurent family. 13-year-old Eve is the mole who uses her phone to spy on her unhappy Calais-based family. A strong cast including Isabelle Huppert and Toby Jones makes this story of intrigue, dysfunction, revenge and deceit a highly enjoyable watch.

Hailed as one of the most influential climbers of all time, Fred Beckey was the original American "Dirtbag" who abandoned societal norms and in pursuit of a nomadic mountaineering lifestyle. He shattered records with an unparalleled string of superhuman first ascents, bushwhacking trails and pioneering routes previously thought impassable. With access to photos, personal journals and rare films, Dave O'Leske's resulting film is a fascinating, emotional and funny insight into a unsung legend.

A Simple Favour

A Simple Favour, a stylish post-modern film noir directed by Paul Feig, centers around Stephanie (Anna Kendrick), a mummy blogger who seeks to uncover the truth behind her best friend Emily's (Blake Lively) sudden disappearance from their small town. Stephanie is joined by Emily's husband Sean (Henry Golding) in this thriller filled with twists and betrayals, secrets and revelations, love and loyalty, murder and revenge.

The Royal Ballet: Mayerling (encore)

3hrs 15mins (includes interval)

Mayerling is a classic of the Royal Ballet repertory, with its emotional depth, haunting imagery, and one of the most demanding roles ever created for a male dancer: Kenneth MacMillan choreographed a complex work around the psychologically tormented heir to the Habsburg Empire, Crown Prince Rudolf. From the ballet's start, the glamour of the Austro-Hungarian court is contrasted with undercurrents of sexual and political intrigue that drive the story to its violent climax in a double suicide.



Mon 22 Oct

Buxton Film: Pad Man

(12A) 2hrs 20mins. No trailers

This is the fictionalised account of a humble Indian metalworker who challenged entrenched taboos when he set about inventing a cheap way to produce sanitary pads. Enduring the disapproval of his family and the embarrassment of his wife, he was determined to end the need for women to use dirty rags because they couldn't afford branded products. An uplifting and big-hearted film.

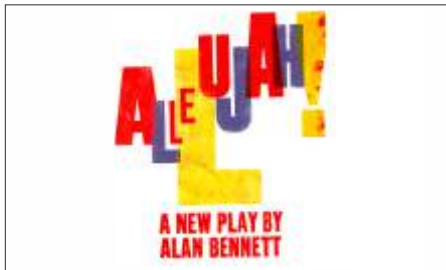
Mon 29 Oct

Buxton Film: The Wound

(15) 1hr 28mins. No trailers

Not many African films break through into the UK, but this film has gained great acclaim. 'X' is a young factory worker assigned to support a westernised city-boy who is enduring his Xhosa tribe's highly ritualised circumcision ceremony. X's return to the mountain camp allows for a secret relationship with a fellow carer. A triangle develops and the film contrasts macho themes with sensitive desires.

A documentary crew, eager to capture its fight for survival, follows the daily struggle to find beds on the Dusty Springfield Geriatric Ward, and the triumphs of the old people's choir.

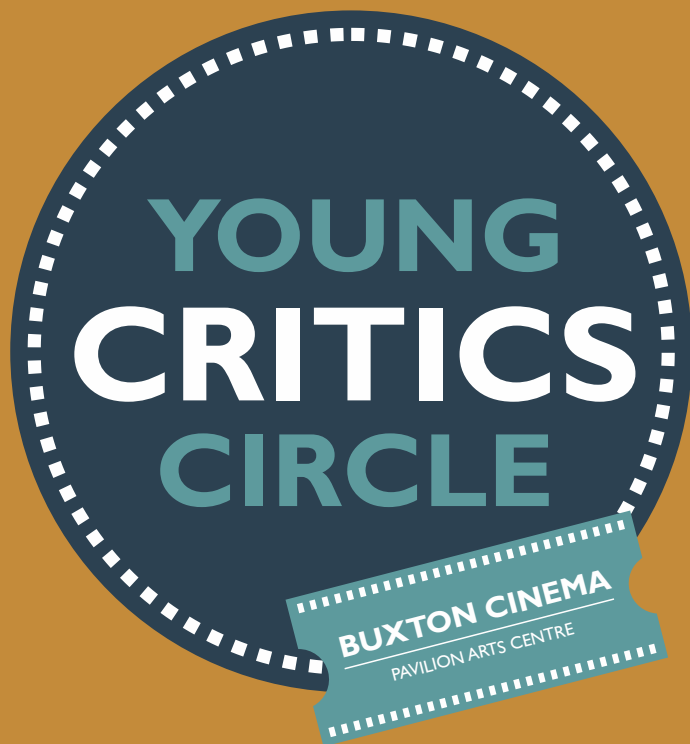
