Colette

(15) 1hr 40mins

After marrying a successful man of letters known as "Willy" (Dominic West), Sidonie-Gabrielle Colette (Keira Knightley) moves from her home in rural France to the artistic splendour of Paris. Willy convinces Colette to ghost-write for him and she pens a semi-autobiographical novel that becomes a cultural sensation and leads to more books. Colette's fight over the ownership of these books defies gender roles and drives her to overcome societal constraints, revolutionizing literature, fashion and sexual expression.

Buxton Film: Nae Pasaran

In 1973 General Pinochet violently took power in Chile. After British made Hawker Hunters were used in the bombing of government buildings they returned for repair at the Rolls Royce factory in East Kilbride but the workers, in an act of solidarity with the people of Chile, decided not to touch them. 40 years later a young director explores this extraordinary stand in powerful documentary combining archive footage and animation.

The true story of Hollywood's greatest comedy double act starring Steve Coogan and John C. Reilly as the legendary movie icons, Stan & Ollie. A heart-warming story of the pair's farewell tour. Despite the pressures of a hectic schedule, and with the support of their wives Lucille and Ida – a formidable double act in their own right - the pair's love of performing, as well as for each other, endures as they secure their place in the hearts of their adoring public.

Destroyer

In Karyn Kusama's riveting new crime thriller Destroyer, the receipt of an ink-marked bill in the office mail propels veteran LAPD detective Erin Bell (Nicole Kidman) on a perilous journey to find the murderer and gang leader, Silas (Toby Kebbell), and perhaps to finally make peace with her tortured past.

Mary, Queen of Scots

Queen of France at 16 and widowed at 18, Mary Stuart defies pressure to remarry, instead, returning to Scotland to reclaim the throne. But Scotland and England fall under the rule of Elizabeth I. Rivals in power and in love, each Queen must decide how to play the game of marriage versus independence. Determined to rule as more than a figurehead, Mary asserts her claim to the English throne, threatening Elizabeth's sovereignty. Betrayal and rebellion within each court imperil both thrones and change the course of history.

A Dog's Way Home chronicles the heartwarming adventure of Bella, a dog who embarks on an epic 400-mile journey home after she is separated from her beloved human.

Based on Naomi Alderman's novel, *Disobedience* is another tale of forbidden love from Oscar-winning director Sebastian Leilo. Rachel Wiesz plays Ronit, a New York based photographer who receives news that her rabbi father has died. Her return to north London's Orthodox Jewish community stirs up more than just emotions when she meets a childhood friend (Rachel McAdams) now the wife of a respected young rabbi.

This gripping film documents the unfolding of this extraordinary story and how pursuit of the truth about what happened led to some unpleasant and unanswered questions.

Cervantes's story of the bumbling knight Don Quixote has inspired countless artistic interpretations. Marius Petipa choreographed this sparkling ballet about the encounters of the man from La Mancha and his faithful squire Sancho Panza. The story follows Don Quixote's picaresque journey to do deeds in honour of his imaginary noble lady, Dulcinea. Sunny, charming, funny and touching, Don Quixote is a ballet as full of uplifting emotion as it is of astonishing ballet technique.

How to Train Your Dragon: The Hidden World

What began as an unlikely friendship between an adolescent Viking and a fearsome dragon has become an epic adventure. Now chief and ruler of Berk, Hiccup has created a gloriously chaotic dragon utopia. When the sudden appearance of female Light Fury coincides with the darkest threat their village has ever faced, Hiccup and Toothless must journey to a hidden world. As their destinies are revealed, dragon and rider must fight together to protect everything they've grown to treasure.

Green Book

Set in America in 1962, Green Book tells the heart-warming true story of Tony Lip (Viggo Mortensen), a working-class Italian-American bouncer who takes on a job as a chauffeur for Dr. Don Shirley (Mahershala Ali), a highly-educated African-American classical pianist. The mismatched pair embark on a two-month tour of concert venues in the racially charged deep south and discover they're on the road to a meaningful and unique friendship.

Buxton Film: Tehran Taboo

(15) 1hr 36mins. No trailers

Animation was the only realistic medium for the Iranian director's frank look at the seedy and troubled underbelly of Iran's capital city. He aims his beautifully executed film at sexual hypocrisy in particular - typified by the shocking opening scene involving Pari, a prostitute, her client and her son who sits quietly in the back of the car. Although the film has been criticised for depicting an Iran of 20 years ago it is still a nuanced and gripping watch.

Second Act is a comedy in the vein of Working Girl and Maid In Manhattan. Jennifer Lopez stars as Maya, a 40-year-old woman struggling with frustrations from unfulfilled dreams. Until, that is, she gets the chance to prove to Madison Avenue that street smarts are as valuable as book smarts, and that it is never too late for a Second Act.
